




McKinley students appear to be more satisfied with their classroom experience than others in the state and complex area, with 3 out of 4 McKinley students reporting a positive classroom climate.




Students who attend school regularly are more likely to read proficiently and do well in school.



Suspensions decreased from 110 in 2015-2016 to 38 in 2019-2020, an indicator of improved school climate.



Language Arts increased 2% at MHS and 3% in HI


Math decreased 17% at MHS and remained the same in HI

Science increased 1% at MHS and 2% in HI


Advanced Placement (AP) courses give students a rigorous college prep experience during high school.




Students who graduated from high school on-time

Each year our graduates earn between \$2 million and \$2.5 million in scholarships which is more than \$10 million in the past 5 years.




All MHS students enroll in one of four career academies:






Percent of students taking the ACT Test




College Going +
